Casa Jimmy Anniversary in Halloween Style

The Saturday morning kicked off with the beneficiaries swapping their clothes for typical 'Festa Agostina' garb ranging from straw hats, checked shirts and patchwork dresses, painted on moustaches and beards as well as freckles.

In traditional style the children danced a 'Quadrilha' under the watchful gaze of their proud parents and family friends. The celebration was rounded off with a hearty spread, with all involved tucking into a selection of typical foods including hot dogs, rice pudding coated with cinnamon, corn cake and salted popcorn.

In addition to this, a Bazaar was also held within the grounds, proceeds of which will be invested into the continual development of the project.

She has thus embarked upon a sporting quest to enter into the Guinness Book of records for the most amount of push ups within a 24 hour time frame, donating all the proceeds to Task Brasil. Eva has so far raised over US\$3000 out of her pledged US\$40,000.

The LONDON MARATHON

Braving the elements on Sunday 26th April 2015 Task Brasil's runners took to the streets of London with gusto and the universal purpose of raising money for the charity. Tim Searle surged to the finish line with a time of 03:25:23 followed closely by Samuel Tucker who finished on a time of 03:48:00. Ten gold bond runners raised the gross amount of over £15,000.00.

GLOBAL VOLUNTEER DAY



In August 2015 Prudential granted Task Brasil with **US\$ 1000 donation** towards the running cost of the projects. CASE STUDY



Samuel joined Casa Jimmy's Project Crescer in March 2012 and during his time at the Project he was viewed upon as an enthusiastic and friendly young man.

He capitalised on all of the opportunities offered at Task Brasil and completed all online courses we offered towards im-

proving his vocational and professional skills. Having taken the decision to enter the world of work he stopped coming to the Project but always kept Task Brasil abreast of his progress.

After passing various exams Samuel, via the 'Youth Apprenticeship Program' secured a role in the exam-marking department of a company. Although he was grateful for the opportunity he felt that there was no room for professional growth and with determination spoke to the Human Resources department of the company who in turn placed him in a

different role. Samuel is now relishing in a new role in the accreditation department and is enjoying the financial independence that comes with working.

Reflecting on his time at Casa Jimmy, Samuel describes it as "an essential and great learning curve" which offered him the chance to "see the world as a beautiful universe full of calculated graceful movements". Casa Jimmy for him was a place where he "could get away from people who would probably not have been good influences".



**THE DAY IN THE LIFE OF A PLACEMENT
VOLUNTEER IN CASA JIMMY**

On completion of his placement, Task Brasil volunteer Charlie Bridge reflected on his time at Casa Jimmy.

What was a typical day like at Casa Jimmy? "...The days were quite full when we were expecting students. The kids would start arriving at least half an hour before the timetable. I would sit and play or chat with whomever had arrived, and really came to enjoy that part of the day because it let me get to know some of the kids very well. I would try and prepare for the days lessons, printing or writing worksheets or setting up games, if time permitted. The day itself was broken into two halves. In the morning we would teach students with state school scheduled for the afternoon, and after lunch we'd have students who had been studying in the morning. For each set of students there would normally be English for half an hour or an hour, some IT, some sport and one of Maths, Art or Reading. During lunch the children are free to play, and I would usually keep an eye out so the other staff could eat in peace. Saturdays were slightly different, as the students would be there for the whole day. There would be a lot more sport, longer lessons and usually a treat (such as a cartoon). On the non-school days I would undertake administrative duties in the office,
